## Scripture Summaries for the Baptism of the Lord

**Isaiah 42: 1-9** Our Old Testament reading today is one of four “Servant Songs” from the Book of Isaiah. These songs are actually poems about God’s servant who will fulfill God’s purpose for the world. Though innocent, this servant will suffer for his people. Christians interpret this prophecy as a prediction of the coming of Jesus.

**Psalm 29** This psalm praises the power of the voice of the Lord, and anticipates the voice from heaven in the story of Jesus’ baptism. The imagery of the psalm leaves no doubt in our minds that God is in charge – His voice resounds over the waters and thunders in the heavens. In spite of all the chaos and turbulence of the world, the psalmist rejoices that God reigns as King forever.

**Acts 10: 34-43** While visiting Cornelius, Peter took the opportunity to address some Gentiles about his faith in Jesus Christ. Cornelius was an officer of the occupying Roman army, and already a believer in God, but Peter broke Jewish law by coming to a Gentile like Cornelius, and preaching to him. Peter told the story of Jesus – how he was baptized by John, anointed with the Holy Spirit, and then how he went about doing good and healing those who were sick.

**Matthew 3: 13-17** The story of Jesus being baptized occurs in all four gospels: today’s reading, as well as Mark 1: 9-11, Luke 3: 21-22 and John 1: 29-34. While there are slight difference in each version, the Spirit of God descends like a dove and Matthew, Mark and Luke each reference a voice coming from heaven. For Matthew, the voice proclaims “This is my Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” For Mark and Luke it is more personal “You are my Beloved Son...” It is interesting to note that God’s affirmation comes before Jesus has begun his ministry. As such, it reminds each of us that God’s overarching love and affirmation precedes all that Jesus, or we, may do in ministry.

## ACTS 10:34-43

## A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS

Peter began to speak to the Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."
